

Why use ILLiad?

- It's fast. Many articles arrive within three days of ordering (although we can't guarantee immediate delivery every time.)
- It's convenient. ILLiad is available from any computer with an internet connection.
- It's easy. You don't have to know what other libraries own the item you want. ILLiad and the ILL staff do the work for you.
- ILLiad keeps track of your orders so you always know where they are in the system, and what you've ordered in the past.

Just for students



What do you do when the OU-Tulsa Library doesn't have the book or article that you need?

You've looked on the shelves. You've checked the current and bound journals. You've searched for electronic resources through Gold Rush or the Bizzell Library catalog. You've asked a library staff member for search help. But you still can't get the one thing you're looking for. What to do?

The solution is simple. Ordering books and articles from other libraries is something we do all the time at the OU-Tulsa Library. The process is called Interlibrary Loan, sometimes abbreviated as ILL, and it's absolutely free for students!

HOW DOES IT WORK?

The OU-Tulsa Library has a web-based ordering system called ILLiad. You can get to ILLiad from the OU-Tulsa Library web site or by going directly to

All you have to do is log on to ILLiad and fill in the article or book citation—the title, author, page numbers, the journal name, and



so forth. The ILL staff takes it from there, and when your book or article arrives, we notify you by email.

You'll pick up the book at the library's front desk. You can access the article by logging on to ILLiad, where you can view the PDF online from any computer.

WHERE DO I SIGN UP?

You can begin using ILLiad after a short one-time registration process. Be sure to have your library barcode ready, since you'll need it to register for ILLiad. If you don't have a library barcode, you can get one in person at the library front desk, or use the online form on the library web site.

Once you complete the ILLiad registration process, you can begin ordering books and articles right away!

ANY RESTRICTIONS?

- Please limit your ordering to materials you need for your classes. To order items for personal use, please contact the Tulsa City-County Library at 918-596-7977 or <http://www.tulsalibrary.org>.
- If the OU-Tulsa Library already owns the item—for example, if it is on reserve, in the reference section, on the shelves, or is available electronically, we will invite you to come to the library to get the item rather than fill your request through ILLiad.
- Only students, faculty, and staff affiliated with the University of Oklahoma are eligible for free interlibrary loan services.

Books can be checked out for three months, and may be renewed for another three months. Renewals can be made by calling 660-3220. Many reserve items check out for a month at a time. Journals and most videos are for in-house use only.

Evidence-based clinical information, available online and via iPhone, Blackberry or other mobile device

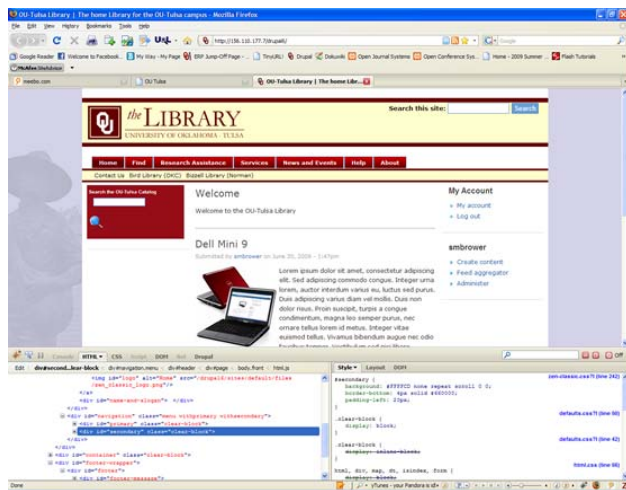
Micromedex

Computers & other technology

All computers are equipped with Internet access and a variety of software programs. The library provides two computers for public use, sixteen computers for student use, and two digital scanners, and printers.

The library also has a wide range of portable technology available for one-week checkout from the front desk, including Dell Mini 9 netbooks, Asus EeePC netbooks, Flip Mino videocameras, USB DVD burners, a Microsoft webcam, and a Dell M109S On-the-Go projector that can fit in the palm of your hand.



Library Web site redesign

The library web site is being redesigned to better serve our students and faculty. Access to library resources and records should be improved, and the overall site design will be friendlier and more accessible. Blog and wiki capabilities will be added, as well as chat-based assistance with library research.

New Library building

Construction on the new library is slated to begin in August 2009. This 22,000 square foot, two-story facility will house the entire collection, as well as a new state-of-the-art computer lab, group study rooms, quiet reading room, and a digital gallery space to exhibit student and faculty projects throughout the year.
